<p>This one story commercial building has a rectangular plan and sits on a concrete foundation. The flat roof is built-up. The walls are covered with vertical tongue and groove and the mansard parapet is clad in wood shingles. Decorative elements are vertical groove plywood. Windows are primarily large fixed-pane. Three bays for the auto repair business have rolling multi-pane doors. The roof for the fuel island extends from the north façade of the building. The building houses two businesses, Mountain Tech, Inc.-Subaru Specialists and a barber shop.</p>
