<p>This one story bungalow is rectangular in plan and sits on a concrete block foundation with basement. The gable roof is covered in composition shingles and is pierced by a chimney. The house is covered with lap siding grounded by a water table and cap. Windows are primarily 6/1 wood double-hung. The gable roof entry porch has a decorative king post in the gable end and is supported by multiple, pressure treated posts. It has an open rail. An exterior chimney highlights the south elevation. A garage has been inserted under the house near the rear. Nice rhododendrons in northwest corner of yard.</p>
