This one story minimal tract is rectangular in plan and sits on a concrete foundation. A one-story addition has been added to the south end of the building over the top of the original garage. The complex (hip on original house and gable on addition) roof is covered in clay tile on the hip and unknown on the gable addition. Both are pierced by an original chimney. The house is covered with lap siding. Windows are primarily 2/2 wood double-hung. There is a bay on the front façade.
