<b>Goal 7, Strategy 7.1 - Determine and Establish Relationships with the Tribes that have a Shared History with Oregon City</b>			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Important or Relevant Dates/Milestones:</li><li>• Staff continues to work with the Confederated Tribe of the Grand Ronde on the implementation of the concept development plan for the property.</li><li>• Staff continues to work with the Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla Indian Reservation and the Confederated Tribe of the Grand Ronde to discuss a potential phase 2 for the Cayuse 5 Memorial.</li><li>• Confederated Tribes of the Gand Ronde applied to amend the conditions of approval associated with the Blue Heron paper mill Master Plan. CTGR have presented a new vision for the tumwata village on the property which they purchased in 2019. The Master Plan amendment was approved by the Planning Commission in a quasi-judicial hearing on January 27, 2025.</li><li>• City staff and CTUIR staff began meeting to kick off the second phase of the tribute project which will include an area for reflection.</li></ul>			

**Status:**

- Confederated Tribes of the Grand Ronde:
  - Staff meets monthly with staff from the Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde to identify opportunities to increase communication, explore formalizing a government-to-government relationship, and support private development.
- Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla Indian Reservation
  - June 3, 2024 marks the date when a permanent tribute to the five Cayuse Men was opened and became available for the public to witness.
  - The Oregon City Historic Review Board and the Park and Recreation Advisory Committee will review this application for adverse impacts or incompatibility with the historic nature of the Promenade or use as a park.
