MEASURE EXPLANATORY STATEMENT FOR COUNTY VOTERS' PAMPHLET

This measure would amend the City Charter to remove the provisions limiting the ability of City Commissioners and the Mayor to serve multiple consecutive terms of office. The current City Charter prohibits people who have served more than two terms of office as a City Commissioner in the previous ten years from running again for the City Commission. This same limitation exists with respect to the Mayor. The four-year term of office will not change under this amendment and therefore, an elected official will have to be reelected every four years to remain in office.

If the measure is approved, the language below would be deleted from Sections 7 and 9 of the Charter respectively:

Section 7 – Commission.

* * * * * No person shall be elected to the office of Commissioner for more than two terms of four years in any ten year period.

Section 9 – Mayor.

* * * * *

If a prospective candidate for election to the office of Mayor has been elected either to the office of Mayor or City Commissioner for more than two terms of four years in the previous ten years, that prospective candidate shall not be eligible for election to the office of Mayor.
