GEOGRAPHIC SETTING: <u>Occupies an interior lot on Elmwood Court, a cul-de-sac in the Hazelwood Subdivision. This house is the only one of its age in the area, being surrounded by contemporary subdivision housing.</u>	
STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE: <u>(Historical and/or architectural importance, dates, events, persons, contexts): The original farmhouse on this property was destroyed by fire around the turn of the century, and the current house was built to replace it. The house served as the main farmhouse for a fifty acre farm, called Hazelfern Dairy, and then later called Hazelwood Dairy. The farm was owned by Ludwig Hartke, who was born in Poland in 1868, emigrating to the U.S. in the late 1880's, and working in the Chicago Stockyards. He arrived in Oregon around 1900, first living in Bolton, and eventually buying the farm for his growing dairy business. The dairy operated until the late 1940's or early 1950's. This house is significant for its association with Hazelwood Dairy.</u>



