Description of Physical and Landscape Features:			
This 1-1/2 story Minimal Traditional has a complex plan that rests on a concrete foundation. Its cross gable roof is covered in composition shingles and is pierced by two interior brick chimney stacks. The exterior is clad in wood shingles and features stucco and half timbering in the front facing gables. Windows are primarily 6/1 and 1/1 double-hung. Decorative features include the carved entry bracket and the lead glass windows. Alterations include the single story addition, a partial window replacement, and the lattice work on the front porch.
