Description of Physical and Landscape Features:			
This 1-1/2 story Minimal Traditional has a complex plan and sits on a poured concrete foundation with basement. The eaveless, gable roof is covered in composition shingles. A chimney rises from the south end of the roof. The southeast (rear) side of the house has a saltbox-shaped roof suggesting a later addition to the house. The house is covered in vinyl siding. The gable on the front façade creates a projecting entry pavilion entered from the side. A side entrance porch is covered with a hipped roof and has a solid rail. Windows are primarily 4-pane fixed windows and 2/2 windows.
