Description of Physical and Landscape Features:			
Tucked well away in trees high off the street, this c.1925 Craftsman features wide barge boards with prominent knee brackets, ornamental fascia décor, exposed rafter tails and plain board window surrounds. A gabled dormer runs three-quarters of the length of the house. Wide corner boards and rake molding finish the cladding of unpainted, wide lap. The windows are 5/1 wood double-hung and some skylights pierce the roof.
