Description of Physical and Landscape Features:			
This one-story 1950s ranch house sits on a corner lot with its main entrance on Jefferson Street, and a double garage on 4th Street. The main house rests under an eaveless hip roof paralleling Jefferson St., while the garage and some of the house has a separate hip roof paralleling 4th St. Beveled lap siding covers the house. Most of the windows are 1/1 wood double-hung, but there are also some horizontal sliding windows. A roman brick chimney extends out of the roof on the Jefferson side. Vinyl siding covers the structure.
