The one-story minimal tract house sits under a series hip roofs which generally meet at the center. Bevel lap siding covers the structure, and 2/2 double-hung windows are used throughout. An addition appears to extend out the back adding to its complex form. The house sits low to the ground on its foundation, and has one step up to an entry porch flanked by a diamond patterned wood screen on the north side. The porch is covered by one of the hip gables.
