This two story mixed style residence/apartment complex has a complex plan of several buildings and additions. There is a buried foursquare at the center, with a modern single story major addition to the north. The original house sits on a concrete foundation and is clad in vinyl siding with vinyl windows. The addition is on a concrete foundation and appears to be brick with multiple low sloped roofs and lots of glass. The site is grounded upon a large rock formation. A separate two story apartment building sits to the south. It has ground floor parking and is clad in plywood board and batten.
