ASSOCIATED STRUCTURES: Old storage shed/garage at southeast lot corner.

KNOWN ARCHAEOLOGICAL FEATURES: None.

GEOGRAPHIC SETTING: Occupies a large corner lot at the intersection of 10th and Harrison Streets. This house is located behind the baseball field at the Oregon City High School and the main school building itself. Other landmark in the general vicinity is at 915 Polk Street (West House, c. 1910).

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE: (Historical and/or architectural importance, dates, events, persons, contexts): No specific biographical information was found on Mary R. Caufield, but most probably she was related in some way to the very prominent Caufield family of Oregon City (banking, politics, law, etc.). This house is definitely older than the surrounding structures. Before the construction of the school building, the site undoubtedly afforded the inhabitant a pleasant view of the hills across the Willamette River. The yard accompanying this house is larger than those in the surrounding neighborhood and has several mature fruit trees and a barn-like structure facing 10th Street. The house is significant for its age and architecture.





