NOTEWORTHY LANDSCAPE FEATURES: Brick retaining wall on Madison and 15th Streets.  
ASSOCIATED STRUCTURES: None.  
KNOWN ARCHAEOLOGICAL FEATURES: None.

GEOGRAPHIC SETTING: Prominently located at the intersection of 15th and Madison Streets. A hillside location, as 15th Street slopes sharply down the hill. A mostly residential neighborhood, with some multi-family uses. Other landmark in area is at 819 - 15th Street (John Naterlin Residence, 1913).

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE: (Historical and/or architectural importance, dates, events, persons, contexts): The house was owned by Anton Naterlin, who worked for Hawley Pulp and Paper Company, and was probably built by A.L. Blanchard, a carpenter, who sold it to Naterlin in 1913. This house, with its wide eaves, rafters and diagonally-braced purlins, has a craftsman-bungalow appearance which is more pronounced than most other bungalows in Oregon City, and is probably one of its most striking bungalows. The variety of textures in materials contribute to its pleasing appearance.

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

